Mark your calendars! On Wednesday, September 6th we will begin a 6 week study by Adam Hamilton, "Making Sense of the Bible."

In Making Sense of the Bible, Adam Hamilton invites us into an honest conversation about the Bible. The book begins with foundational questions such as: How and when was the Bible written? Who decided which books made it into the scriptures and why? How literally must we read it? And, is the Bible ever wrong?

From there, Hamilton considers the real questions people frequently ask that continue to divide Christians and denominations alike, including:

- Were Adam and Eve real people?
- Why is God so violent in the Old Testament?
- Why would Paul command women to keep silent in the church?
- Is Jesus the only way to salvation?
- How does God view homosexual people?
- Is the Book of Revelation a guide to the End Times

In approachable and inviting language, Hamilton addresses these often misunderstood biblical themes leading listeners to a deeper appreciation of the Bible so that we might hear God speak through it and find its words to be life-changing and life-giving.

Worship for August - Searching for the Face of God

Throughout our summer worship we've been discovering what it means to be a disciple of Jesus Christ. We've been honest about the difficulty but also considered some of the joys that come with following this path. This final part of the series is in some ways a pinnacle. The community that gathers for worship is reminded that we are indeed following a God who is at work in the world. We are seeking signs of God's presence as we live and work in a hurting yet beautiful world around us. There is no more difficult but ultimately joyous exercise than that.

August 6: "Wrestle Mania- Wrestling with Our Hunger" Genesis 32:22-31, Matthew 14:13-21

Many years ago, there was a television commercial that began with the line, "What are you hungry for when you don't know what you're hungry for?" A powerful question to be sure. I think their answer was crackers. But the question itself seems deeper and more profound than that. Advertising often tries to take spiritual hungers and offer physical solutions because they have something to sell, but it leaves us unsatisfied in the end. So, what are we hungry for? That's the question we're wrestling with this week.

August 13: Joy Sharon Fortune will be preaching about Joy.

August 20: "Is it Fair?"

Genesis 45:1-15, Matthew 15: 10-28

This title is not aspirational, but descriptive. This is not who we should be, but it is often who we are. We claim to want fairness, or at least we want fairness in a way that benefits us. Fairness in our favor, we might say. Deep down, however, the truth is that we don't really want fairness; we want mercy. At least that is what we want from God. At the same time, we want to deal fairly and be dealt with fairly as we live and work in the world.

August 27: "The Journey Begins" "Who Do You Say?" Matthew 16:13-20

We seem to be always beginning. Or at least we have a tendency to speak about how we start our journey of faith. To some, that seems redundant. "We began long ago," they might think. And that could be true. Yet, each day is a new beginning, a reaffirmation of the desire to be a disciple of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world. So, once again, the journey begins.

Out of nowhere, it seemed, as they traveled along, Jesus asked his disciples a question of identity. "Who do you say that I am?" It's a question we must answer again and again as we seek to become disciples of Jesus Christ.



The 20th Annual Hike for the Homeless benefits Family Promise of the Chippewa Valley Inc, which owns and operates the Beacon House Shelter in Eau Claire. We provide homeless families with temporary shelter and help them find permanent homes and become financially independent. In 2022 we provided shelter and other services to 87 families with 52 children in our community. Our annual event helps provide us with the financial resources to provide these services.

The Hike for the Homeless will be held on Tuesday, August 15th, at River Prairie Park in Altoona, Wisconsin. Participants will walk all or part of the 2.8-mile course.
