

We have a couple regular email distribution lists. Please let Kristen know if you would like to be included on any of the following lists, if you aren't already, or if you need to update the email address you prefer to receive these emails at. You can also be removed from any email distribution list. Just reach out.



- 1) Weekly Email List: This distribution list is mainly used on a weekly basis for the Saturday morning "Worship & News" email with updates for Sunday worship and announcements for the week. It is also used occasionally when there is a big announcement to be shared, a special gathering coming up, or a prayer request for the full congregation.
- 2) **Monthly Newsletter List**: Even though our newsletter is always available online at our website, or through the link in the weekly email, we do send out a monthly email specific to the newsletter.
- 3) **Prayer Chain List**: This is a smaller group of people who have chosen to be part of a prayer team. These emails are not scheduled, but rather are sent out when a prayer request comes in.



April 6th (5th Sunday of Lent and Holy Communion) "Connection" Psalm 149

Awe is a gateway to connection. As we have experiences that give us a sense of being part of something larger than "just us," our penchant for self-preservation and obsession with the competitive default-self gives way to a renewed commitment to the greater whole. We need moments of "collective effervescence" that increase hope and joy at being part of the human family.

April 13th (Palm Sunday) "Self-giving" Psalm 118. Luke 19:28-40


A sense of awe can include witnessing acts of "moral beauty." Jesus' entrance into Jerusalem was such an act as he continued his ministry of lifting up the cause of the lowly and advocating for the power of peace and justice. Research shows that when we witness with awe others' kindness, courage, strength, and overcoming, we are more likely to feel inspired to give ourselves in service of the good. We become more self-giving, more ready to lend a helping hand or commit energy to making the world a better place.

Holy Week

April 17th Maundy Thursday (6pm, Pleasant Valley- with Holy Communion) "Scenes Along the Way"

Holy Week is full of the most awesome and awful moments of our faith narrative. It is a story that mirrors the vast range of human pathos and can teach us much about moving through life—and death. Many persons who report near-death experiences reveal elements of awe such as a connection to all things, bliss, compassion, and a sense of deep peace. What if we cultivated these right now as holy intentions for our lives—way before we reach the moment of death? We gather to eat, pray, and wait for the light.

April 18th Good Friday (6pm, Lake Street UMC) "Stripped Away: A Service of Emptying and Surrender"



Easter isn't just one Sunday-it's a season. And resurrection isn't just something to believe in-it's something to live. We begin a new worship series called **Rooted in Resurrection**. Each week, we'll explore what it means to not just believe *in* Jesus, but to grow *into* the life he offers. This is a call to action. The world is aching for embodied hope, for justice that feeds, for water that renews, for roots that hold strong in uncertain times. This isn't a time to sit back. It's time to live what we say we believe. Come ready to move. Come ready to be changed. Come be *rooted in resurrection*.

April 20th Easter Sunday

It is Easter; let there be light! Let there be color and music and joy. In everything, let there be joy as we worship this day.

April 27th "Embodied Believing" Revelation 1:4-8, John 20:19-31

Belief is not just what we think, it's how we live-what we do with our hands, where we go with our feet, how we show up in the world. Like Thomas, we come to believe when we touch, feel, and experience Christ in the body.

Why use online giving?

- Convenient & Secure
- Allows you to view your contribution history (regardless of how you made the contribution)

How does online giving work?

You can either set up your contributions through secure ACH (bank account) or with a credit card, whichever is more convenient for you.

Are there fees?

You will not be charged any fees and will receive credit for your full contribution. The church will be assessed processing fees. You will have the option to make a donation to help offset these fees, but it is not required.

- ACH (US ONLY): \$0.25 flat rate per transaction If the contributor chooses to use instant verification, there is a one-time \$1.50 fee for each bank account that a donor connects. After this initial fee, ACH transactions have a flat rate of \$0.25/transaction.
- Credit Card Processing Fees: 2.2% + \$.30 per transaction (3.5% for Amex)

ELECTRONIC GIVING:

- 1. You can set up automatic electronic payments through your individual financial institution. For example, RCU has a Bill Pay option where you can designate the church as a payee and decide how often you'd like them to mail a paper check to the church or make an electronic payment to the church.
- 2. We will be phasing out our current ACH Electronic Giving option with Vanco and transitioning to the new Online Giving option through ChruchTrac, our church management software. If you are currently using the VANCO system, there is no need to make any changes if you'd like to continue using this form of payment, but we will not be creating any new accounts.

GIFT CARD COLLECTION to fill the FOOD PANTRY



To be more flexible and responsive to the needs of those using our Little Food Pantry, we are adding another option for contributions.

You can now bring in grocery gift cards from any area grocery store (any amount) instead of actual food items. Our team will use these gift cards to purchase needed items. This allows them to purchase during sales and better monitor when certain items/needs are in higher demand.

So, next time you are purchasing your groceries, throw in a gift card for the food pantry. It's that simple to make a difference! If you prefer, pantry items donations or monetary gifts can still be made.

NOTE: Gift Card donations will be treated like Goods" other "In-Kind or Donated contributions. You are giving an item to the church. If you would like this contribution to appear on your giving statement, you must fill out a REIMBURSEMENT/DONATION OF GOODS FORM (copies are in the office) and select the "Donation" box. Your gift will be recorded as Donated Goods /Gift Card on your giving statement, without a dollar amount. It is up to you to keep a copy of your receipt to record the value for tax purposes.
