Dear Hope Community,

This past month, the world said goodbye to a spiritual giant. Pope Francis, who led with humility, compassion, and a deep commitment to the margins, passed from this life into the mystery of resurrection. Whether or not we are Catholic, his witness spoke across boundaries. He reminded us that to follow Jesus is not just to believe something, but to live something.

In one of his most well-known quotes, Pope Francis said:

"You pray for the hungry. Then you feed them. That's how prayer works."


That's also how belief works.

During this Easter season, we're exploring what it means to be Rooted in Resurrection—to live in the hope that Jesus is still showing up, still transforming us, still calling us to love in bold, embodied ways. And that brings us to the story of Thomas.

Poor Thomas gets a bad reputation, "Doubting Thomas", but really, he just wanted what everyone else had: an encounter with the Risen Christ. He needed to see and touch. And Jesus didn't scold him. Jesus came close. Jesus showed up. That's the heart of our faith. Not abstract ideas, but a God who enters into our questions, who meets us in our pain, who holds out scarred hands and says, "Peace be with you."

Here's the thing: belief isn't just about thinking the right things. It's about doing the right things, too. It's feeding the hungry, welcoming the stranger, sitting with someone who's grieving. It's baking bread, planting gardens, offering second chances. That's the kind of belief that changes the world.




Stay Updated & Connected

We have a couple regular email distribution lists. Please let Kristen know if you would like to be included on any of the following lists, if you aren't already, or if you need to update the email address you prefer to receive these emails at. You can also be removed from any email distribution list. Just reach out.



- 1) Weekly Email List: This distribution list is mainly used on a weekly basis for the Saturday morning "Worship & News" email with updates for Sunday worship and announcements for the week. It is also used occasionally when there is a big announcement to be shared, a special gathering coming up, or a prayer request for the full congregation.
- 2) **Monthly Newsletter List**: Even though our newsletter is always available online at our website, or through the link in the weekly email, we do send out a monthly email specific to the newsletter.
- 3) **Prayer Chain List**: This is a smaller group of people who have chosen to be part of a prayer team. These emails are not scheduled, but rather are sent out when a prayer request comes in.



ROOTED IN RESURRECTION - MAY 2025 WORSHIP THEMES

May 4, 2025 – Hospitality and Food Equity

Scripture: John 21:1–19

Jesus invites his disciples to breakfast after the resurrection, reminding us that love starts with welcome. This Sunday focuses on God's hospitality, the justice of food equity, and the grace we receive in both baptism and the shared table. We celebrate a baptism as a sign of new life and welcome in God's abundant family.

May 11, 2025 - Springs of Living Water

Scripture: John 4:1–15 (or Revelation 7:9–17)

Water is the sign of our renewal and the source of our life in Christ. We are not meant to hoard grace, but to be channels of living water for others. This week we reflect on how resurrection calls us to be refreshed—and to refresh the world through our compassion, justice, and joy.

May 18, 2025 - A New World

Scripture: Revelation 21:1–6

God is creating something new out of what already exists. Resurrection is not escape—it's transformation. We are called to be co-creators of the new world God is building. This Sunday we imagine the world not as it is, but as it could be.

May 25, 2025 - The Tree of Life

Scripture: Revelation 22:1-5

Trees represent rootedness, growth, and the interconnectedness of all creation. In the resurrection life, we are nourished by God's grace and invited to bear fruit for the healing of the world.

Why use online giving?

- Convenient & Secure
- Allows you to view your contribution history (regardless of how you made the contribution)

How does online giving work?

You can either set up your contributions through secure ACH (bank account) or with a credit card, whichever is more convenient for you.

Are there fees?

You will not be charged any fees and will receive credit for your full contribution. The church will be assessed processing fees. You will have the option to make a donation to help offset these fees, but it is not required.

- ACH (US ONLY): \$0.25 flat rate per transaction If the contributor chooses to use instant verification, there is a one-time \$1.50 fee for each bank account that a donor connects. After this initial fee, ACH transactions have a flat rate of \$0.25/transaction.
- Credit Card Processing Fees: 2.2% + \$.30 per transaction (3.5% for Amex)

ELECTRONIC GIVING:

- 1. You can set up automatic electronic payments through your individual financial institution. For example, RCU has a Bill Pay option where you can designate the church as a payee and decide how often you'd like them to mail a paper check to the church or make an electronic payment to the church.
- 2. We will be phasing out our current ACH Electronic Giving option with Vanco and transitioning to the new Online Giving option through ChruchTrac, our church management software. If you are currently using the VANCO system, there is no need to make any changes if you'd like to continue using this form of payment, but we will not be creating any new accounts.

Pack & Pray for a Purpose Sunday, May 18 after Worship

Imagine being the hands of Christ in someone's darkest hour—when disaster strikes and everything is lost, *you* can be part of the healing.

For someone caught in a crisis—whether a flood, fire, or conflict—a simple bar of soap or a fresh washcloth isn't just hygiene. It's dignity. It's hope. It's knowing someone cares.

We're assembling UMCOR Hygiene Kits that go directly to communities facing disaster and displacement. These kits are small, but they meet real, urgent needs in the moment they're needed most.

We're packing after worship on **Sunday, May 18**, and every kit we prepare could be in someone's hands within days of a disaster. The need is real, and the time is now.

Action:

- Bring hygiene items (toothbrushes, combs, soap, etc.—the list is provided below.
- 2. **Join us after worship** for a quick, meaningful mission moment: *Pack & Pray*
- 3. Be part of a miracle in motion.

Important Notes:

- All items must be new.
- Do not wash any of the items as they will no longer be considered new.
- Do not include any personal notes, money or additional materials in the kits.
- Contents of kits or the containers of kits should not be imprinted with cartoon characters, advertisements, religious, patriotic, military or camouflage symbols.



Hygiene Kit

Value: \$12.00 per kit

Hygiene Kit Materials

- One hand towel (15 x 25 –17 x 27 inches)
 - No kitchen, cleaning, or microfiber towels
- One washcloth
 - No kitchen, cleaning, or microfiber towels
- One comb
 - Must be sturdy with at least 4-7 inches of teeth.
 - No pocket combs or picks
 - Rattail and combs without handles are acceptable but must have at least 4-7 inches of teeth.
- One toenail or fingernail clipper
 - No emery boards or metal nail files
- Bath-size soap (3 oz. bar or larger)
 - No Ivory or Jergen's soap
 - Do not remove from packaging.
- One adult toothbrush
 - Do not remove from packaging.
 - Personal advertising not acceptable
- 10 adhesive bandages (¾ by 3 inches)
 - Common household bandages acceptable
- One one-gallon size re-sealable bag
 *Do not add toothpaste when assembling kits

To be more flexible and responsive to the needs of those using our Little Food Pantry, we are adding another option for contributions.

You can now bring in grocery gift cards from any area grocery store (any amount) instead of actual food items. Our team will use these gift cards to purchase needed items. This allows them to purchase during sales and better monitor when certain items/needs are in higher demand.


So, next time you are purchasing your groceries, throw in a gift card for the food pantry. It's that simple to make a difference! If you prefer, pantry items donations or monetary gifts can still be made.

NOTE: Gift Card donations will be treated like other "In-Kind or Donated Goods" contributions. You are giving an item to the church. If you would like this contribution to appear on your giving statement, you must fill out a REIMBURSEMENT/DONATION OF GOODS FORM (copies are in the office) and select the "Donation" box. Your gift will be recorded as Donated Goods /Gift Card on your giving statement, without a dollar amount. It is up to you to keep a copy of your receipt to record the value for tax purposes.


